INTRODUCTION:

This report provides Cairns Regional Council with a summary of the sport and recreation planning projects, the status of implementing these plans and other precincts.

BACKGROUND:

A previous update on this topic was provided at the 22 May 2008 SACCS meeting. Furthermore, the respective projects have also been considered by Council at various stages since 2008.

COMMENT:

A summary of the actions completed since May 2008 is outlined below. Also included are the priority actions within the next six years and an overall cost summary.

All timelines for "Priority Actions" are indicative only and are subject to future Council budget deliberations and in some instances, external funding application success.

Manunda Sporting Precinct Actions North Behan Street: completed Master plan adopted by Council, May 2009. Unformed road within precinct closed to allow for infrastructure to be developed. Upgrades completed on AFL field to make area playable for 2009 AFL Masters National Carnival. The cost of this project to Council was \$36,050, with AFL Cairns providing considerable additional spend/labour to achieve a mutually beneficial result. Sealing of internal road, cost \$15,000. Preliminary design of area finalised in 2011, in consultation with lessees. Funding application to construct stage 1 (development of unused area for soccer and cricket) approved by Queensland Government, to commence in 2012. Endeavour Park: Master plan adopted by Council May 2010. Unformed road closure and acquisition of trustee land from Department of Environment and Resource Management (DERM,) to allow for expansion of fields to west. Completed works:

Edmonton Sport and Recreation Facility Needs Study

Indoor and aquatic facilities:

- Location and mix of facilities determined via Edmonton Multi-purpose and Aquatic Centre feasibility study, completed and adopted by Council in December 2009.
- Various funding applications submitted for stage 1 implementation were unsuccessful.
- Funding for stage 1 now secured via Queensland Government and Abu Dhabi cyclone shelter funding, as well as the Federal Government's Better Regions funding programme.
- Detailed design of stage 1 close to completion.

Difficult to locate sports:

- Resolution by Council in 2010 to pursue land in Thomson Road, adjacent to existing speedway precinct, however, the land owner advised the land is currently not for sale.
- Council formally written to Tablelands Regional Council (TRC) and Cairns Kart Racing Club to advise that a regional motor sport (and difficult to locate sports) precinct will be pursued collaboratively with TRC at a mutually agreed time and no earlier than 2012. Subsequent discussion with TRC officers.

Priority actions

Field sports:

- Progress MCU process to allow senior sporting group use at Petersen Park, Edmonton and lighting to the second field.
- 2010/11 money allocated to install lights on second field at Petersen Park.
- 2010/11 Walker Road scoping and preliminary design, 2014/15 detailed design.
- Advocate for the most advantageous outcome for Council in relation to the Education Queensland land adjacent to Petersen Park, ie transferred to Council as trustee land at no cost.
- Continue dialogue with schools with respect to use of facilities by community groups.
- 2015-2017 staged development of Walker Road for field sports.

Indoor and aquatic facilities:

- Determine tenure and management of centre for stage 1.
- 2014/15 detailed design of aquatic facilities
- 2015-2017 implementation of aquatic facilities
- 2016/17 decommission Edmonton pool

Difficult to locate sports:

 2011/12, collaborate with TRC to find a suitable location for a regional motor sport precinct.
