			Indigenous owned not just fronted by staff.	

	Brett Spencer	Council Update – First Peoples	 Suggested to include the use of traditional languages of local custodians on future Council uniforms. Members raised concerns with the use of a particular provider. Discussed the positive and negative factors that must be considered and spoken about publicly in the broader community when engaging in increasing and improving recruitment and retention. Discussed the need to educate Council regarding the contributions of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander citizens and community organisations to local business, infrastructure, rates and community wellbeing. Need to focus the RAP on Cairns and consider the history of the region and look deeper at policies and procedures to ensure there is meaning and substance.
