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ANNUAL ASSESSMENT REPORT 2021/2022 – PLANNING AND ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE

RECOMMENDATION:

That Council notes the findings of the formal assessment of performance against the Terms of Reference for the Planning and Environment Committee, and that these findings indicate that the Committee has performed in accordance with the Terms of Reference.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

This report details the outcomes of the formal assessment of performance against the terms of reference for the Planning and Environment Committee as required by the General Policy – Planning and Environment Committee – Terms of Reference.

There were eight meetings held during the year ended 30 June 2022 with a total of 56 reports considered by the Committee, of which 49 were in open session and seven (7) were in closed session.

This annual assessment finds that the Planning and Environment Committee has performed in accordance with its terms of reference during the year ended 30 June 2022.

BACKGROUND:

At the Ordinary Meeting of Council held on the 12 August 2020, Council established the Planning and Environment Committee.

The Terms of Reference establish the framework within which this committee operates with reference to obligations specified in the *Local Government Act 2009* and other guiding documents adopted by Council.

The Committee membership comprises the full Council and has full delegated authority.

COMMENT:**PURPOSE AND PERFORMANCE:**

The following table provides an overview of the reports tabled at the Cairns Regional Council Planning and Environment Committee meetings during the 2021/2022 financial year. These reports have been grouped into the following categories based on the Purpose, Responsibilities and Powers of the Committee as listed in the General Policy.
