CAIRNS FESTIVAL 2023 WRAP-UP

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The 2023 Cairns Festival once again showcased a diverse and successful array of events with the highest ever audience attendance of approx. 140,000, including 210 performances featuring 776 performers and artists, with an estimated 77% participation from local artists.

The Cairns Festival programming team maintains a strong focus on creating a curated program whilst building partnerships with major and emerging local talent, state performing arts organisations and touring companies. This year's festival also provided outstanding opportunities for local artists and performers.

The 2023 program featured music, physical theatre, comedy, roving performances, puppetry, high end projection and laser work, dance, film, cabaret, multimedia installations and visual arts, activating venues in the city and throughout the region. The programming team committed to the festival vision of delivering a vibrant, progressive and collaborative arts and cultural festival that reflects the region's unique stories and celebrates the distinctive colours and hues of our tropical lifestyle. Furthermore, to ensure Cairns Festival is accessible to audiences across the region there was a continued focus on programming free events. In 2023, 91% of the 210 performances were free to public.

BACKGROUND:

Annually the Cairns Festival seeks to provide a platform for local talent to shine, with close to 600 local artists, performers and creatives featured in this year's program. The 2023 festival also saw the continuation of partnerships with AGB Events for the City Library projection and Laservision for the Esplanade light installation. The collaboration with Laservision and the festival team continued to develop, with this year's focus on including more local content by featuring artworks from 12 First Nations artists displayed on the Esplanade boulevard and a stand-alone projection story for the lagoon laser show. It also saw the inclusion of the World Heritage-listed Wet Tropics rainforest, providing an installation connecting both the reef and rainforest.

Program Highlights

Reef Lights: Where the Rainforest Meets the Reef – Estimated attendance 25,100 After a resounding success in 2022, Reef Lights returned to the Cairns Esplanade for its second year. This year's installation focused on where the rainforest meets the reef, combining two World Heritage-listed icons, the Great Barrier Reef, and the Wet Tropics rainforest. Reef Lights celebrated the interconnection of these two magical worlds nightly as part of Cairns Festival. Under the creative direction and expertise of internationally renowned light artists Laservision, guests were immersed in an impressive light journey that harnesses the remnants of these ancient lands and washed the Cairns Esplanade with a kaleidoscope of colour. Reef Lights was an extraordinary journey for all guests, incorporating innovative technologies, vibrant colours, captivating lasers, digital artworks, and enchanting soundscapes, while making a dramatic statement about Cairns, its unique culture and its strong connection to two of Australia's most incredible natural wonders. The project presented the work of 12 First Nations artists from our region. The highlight being the Lagoon projection show featuring collaboration and local First Nation storytelling, artwork and music by Hendrik Fourmile, Susan Reys and Shaun Creek, telling the story of how the Cassowary, known as Gindaja, lost its ability to fly and became the land roaming bird we know today.

<u>Introducing... – Estimated attendance 1,000</u>

Introducing... was an emerging local artist showcase on the Main Stage at the Esplanade on the first Sunday of the festival. This event has garnered immense popularity and featured a range of up-and-coming artists who had participated in capacity-building and developmental workshops through Creative Life's *Flame* program. The workshops helped participants to refine their stagecraft skills and prepare their performances for the festival.

<u>City Lights - Rowland Nancarrow's Unveiling Nature – Estimated attendance 14,000</u>
This year's large-scale projection on the City Library stepped into a world where vibrant hues and delicate brushstrokes came to life in an exquisite fusion of art and technology. Spectators embarked on a mesmerising journey through the transformational power of animated projection artwork, where the botanical wonders of Cairns-based and internationally renowned artist, Roland Nancarrow's, tropical flower watercolours transcended the boundaries of the traditional canvas.

Flamingos by Dead Puppet Society – Estimated attendance 3,000 (across 3 days) Flamingos was a roving puppet performance co-commissioned by Cairns Festival and visual theatre masterminds Dead Puppet Society. The flappy-footed flamboyant flock explored their peculiar new environments at the Esplanade, dining precinct, Court House Gallery, Tanks Arts Centre and Cairns Performing Arts Centre (CPAC), charming passers-by with equal parts absurdity, silliness and sincerity. With their bodies bobbing and feathers flapping to funky disco beats, these unexpected roving visitors were the undisputed life of the party.

<u>Gulgi-barra</u> by Miriki Performing Arts - Estimated attendance 5,200 (across 4 days) Gulgi-barra (meaning Sand People) was a new and locally produced dance work that paid homage to the ancient Gulgi-barra clan of the Yidindji tribe of Far North Queensland. Uncle David Mundraby, a living descendant of the Gulgi-barra clan shared sand stories to a backdrop of exquisite choreography and a choral soundscape, which encapsulated how sand plays an important role in our customs. This work engaged an ensemble of 38 First Nations performers and employed 9 First Nations arts workers.

<u>String Symphony</u> by Spare Parts Puppet Theatre – Estimated attendance 17,500 (across 4 days)

Created by Australia's renowned puppetry company, Spare Parts Puppet Theatre, with designer and puppet maker Leon Hendroff, *String Symphony* was a large-scale, interactive performance installation that used puppetry to explore connection, community and collaboration. *String Symphony* was the story of Leor's awakening and discovery of both himself and his connection to others. Hand-woven using more than one kilometre of rope, the giant marionette was suspended within a five-metre truss. Illuminated from the inside by 600 LED lights, Leor was brought to life by 600 community members (across the 4 days) when each took a string and worked together to move and manipulate the puppet. This work employed four local arts workers to support its activation and delivery.

Grand Parade and Fireworks – Estimated attendance 6,000 (Fireworks)

Due to inclement (and highly unpredictable) weather, the difficult decision was made to cancel this year's Grand Parade. Valuable preparation time was lost due to rain prior to the parade, making it near impossible for the 62 registered floats to prepare and take part safely. Throughout what was a very unpredictable day, the Main Stage featured some of the best artists from the region - headlined by Electrik Lemonade, playing to a heaving mass on the Western Event Lawn. Reef Lights, String Symphony and the Aerobatic Aircraft Display all went ahead wowing spectators, along with Dead Puppet Society's roving flamingo puppets that flapped their way along the Esplanade and dining precinct. The community showed their festival spirit with an enthusiastic crowd showing up to experience the night sky explode at the spectacular fireworks display.

Bite Club by Briefs Factory - Attendance 550 (across 2 shows)

A crowd favourite with two sell-out shows, *Bite Club* featuring Brisbane's award-winning cult-cabaret mischief-makers, circus stars and heart-stopping hooligans Briefs Factory, who joined forces with much celebrated and sainted songbird Sahara Beck. In an event sautéed in a hedonistic haze, guests were treated to a shotgun wedding and table settings of music, circus, drag, burlesque, theatre and comedy. Described as one of Australia's most arresting performers, Sahara Beck's soaring vocals blasted female pride power into a ferociously fierce display of talent. The slick tomfoolery and heart-stopping hooliganism bathed in suave synth, heady hooks and swelling strings, all set to a glorious pop pulse.

Hot & Heavy by The Ironing Maidens – Attendance 200 (across 2 shows)

A locally developed work by creative geniuses, The Ironing Maidens. Audiences were immersed in a unique interactive experience that was part installation, part performance, and part banging dance party. A speculative fabulation, a non-binary, de-capitalised, decolonised, de-extinction future imagining. *Hot & Heavy* by The Ironing Maidens was an aural, visual and sensory experience that invited everyone to lose their friends, go deep and shake free. *Hot & Heavy* electrified Cairns with its world premiere show - one of their most ambitious performance work to date.

The Jungle Giants – Attendance 1,400

With well over half a billion streams worldwide, a #1 ARIA-charting album and selling out tour dates from hemisphere to hemisphere, The Jungle Giants delivered an explosive performance fuelled by their signature buoyant melodies and infectious choruses that had the crowd bopping and singing along for what was a truly memorable night.

<u>Suburban Satellite - Light Moves by Bonemap – Attendance 3,000</u>

Light Moves continues to be a Festival crowd favourite. It's a world of performance, colour and projection art reflected in the calm waters of Lake Placid on a broad stretch of the Barron River. The lake is a Djabugay story water place. The narrative of this place was told through an animation of creation motifs, specific to the location represented through artwork by Yirrganydji/Djabugay artist Bernard Lee Singleton Jr. This and other animated artworks were projected across the water onto the rainforest gorge. Featuring a series of episodes moving between shimmering Indigenous art adapted for animation and projection, roving light performers, integrated new media art installations, live musicians and Indigenous dancers.

Festival HQ Stage at Court House Gallery – Estimated attendance 2,000 (across 9 nights) Festival HQ Stage launched with a spectacular Welcome to Country and Healing Ceremony, putting First Nation dance, music and storytelling front and centre. The Court House Gallery was the official hub for live music each night of the festival, presenting the talents of more than 30 local bands and artists showcasing a diverse range of musical genres and acts. A pop-up bar operated throughout the festival and the Court House Gallery opened each day from 10am to 9pm.

Bolster & Lee: The Knock 'Em Downs – Estimated attendance 2,750 (across 8 days)

The Knock 'Em Downs was a comically interactive and visually engaging trip back in time to the side shows of old. Audiences stepped inside a colourful circus tent and experienced the crazy world of fun and games, where nostalgia took a curious twist and the carnies turned into clowns!

Roald Dahl's The Twits - Attendance 1,800 (across 2 shows)

Roald Dahl's gruesome twosome *The Twits*, delighted and disgusted, with sold out shows at CPAC.

<u>Carnival on Collins – Attendance 27,000</u>

Families from around the region again attended this annual Father's Day celebration which featured over 180 market stalls, a fantastic local line up of music, plus dance and roving entertainment from Cairns and the Cape.

COMMENT:

An economic impact assessment was conducted through the engagement of contractor, IER, for Cairns Festival 2023. The evaluation of the Cairns Festival was conducted to determine the economic and tourism impacts and benefits of the event to the Cairns and Queensland economies. The evaluation was conducted using the economic assessment models to estimate the overnight visitor expenditure as well as the direct and incremental spending attributable to the event. Staff and volunteers cold canvased attendees at profile festival events capturing their contact details, a post event survey link was then sent to them, as well as ticket buyers who had opted in to receive third party material. In total, 487 surveys were completed with key results as follows:

- Cairns Festival generated direct and incremental expenditure of \$1,991,848 attributable to the Cairns economy and \$1,222,550 attributable to the Queensland economy.
- Cairns Festival was responsible for generating 10,855 visitor nights to Cairns. The majority of these nights were generated by interstate visitors (6,047).

- In total, \$1,869,958 was spent by overnight visitors who stayed more than 40km from their normal place of residence. The majority of this spending was undertaken by interstate visitors (\$961,115).
- When assessing 'community pride', Cairns Festival scores well on the majority of indicators. The highest level of agreement was recorded for the statements 'Cairns Festival helps to enhance community spirit, pride and enjoyment', 'It helps make the Cairns region a more enjoyable place to live' and 'It is well-liked and positively embraced by the people of Cairns' (4.5/5).

Cairns Festival's success each year is dependent upon ongoing engagement from the Cairns community. From people participating in activities, to volunteering and attending as audiences, the unique energy and feel of our distinctly 'Cairns' festival comes from this. As such, the team would like to thank the community for another safe and successful Cairns Festival.

The Creative Life team would also like to extend thanks across Cairns Regional Council. Each year the programming and festivals team calls upon skillsets and expertise across Council to assist in delivering all aspects of the Cairns Festival – this event would not be possible without this ongoing collaboration.

The festival was also supported by a passionate contingent of local volunteers who share a love for the arts and giving back to their community, with 30 volunteers contributing 350 hours and 91 shifts to support the delivery of festival events.

Encourage groups to self set up and move into place 1-3pm. Encourage a community Facebook group for participants. You would encourage greater community feedback that way. Programme was great
