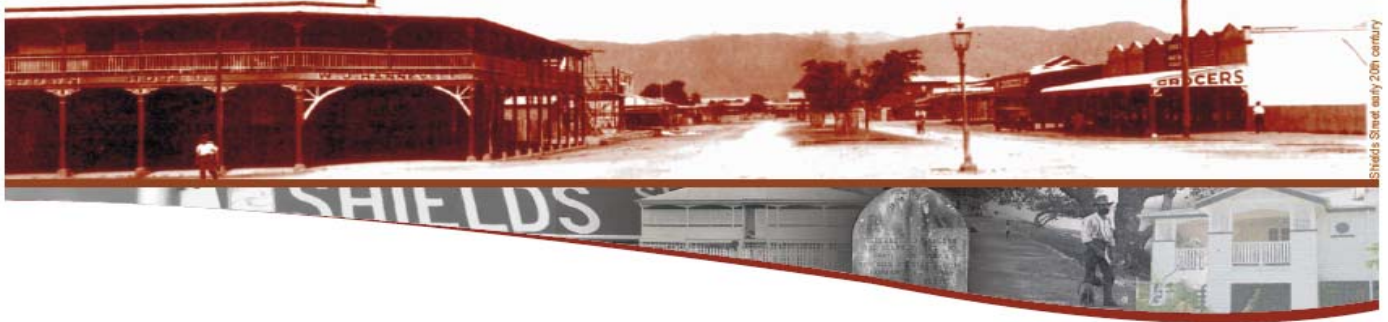




'Y' Street Names

Street Name	Suburb	Street Name Origin
Yanchep Close	Kewarra Beach	Named after an Australian beaches theme, Yanchep beach is north of Perth in Western Australia. The site was surveyed on the 5th May 1988 and was registered by the Mulgrave Shire Council for Kewarra Developments Pty. Ltd. on the 22nd of June 1988.
Yangoora Street	White Rock	Yangoora is an Aboriginal name for a stringybark or eucalyptus tree. This street was surveyed on the 7 th of August 1973 for the Shire of Mulgrave and was registered on the 4 th of April 1974.
Yara Street	Bayview Heights	Many streets in this area are named after birds and Yara is an Aboriginal name for a bird of the sea or a seagull. The site was surveyed on the 8th October 1973 for the Shire of Mulgrave and was registered on the 18th December 1973.
Yarrabah Road	Green Hill to East Trinity	This is the road leading to the Yarrabah township.
Yarrum Street	Earlville	This street is titled Murray spelt in reverse. W. Murray was the sub-divider of property.
Yates Court	White Rock	This street was named for a motion picture theme after Peter Yates who was a Director who made 23 Hollywood movies. Born on the 24 th July 1929 in Hampshire UK, he creatively peaked between 1968 and 1973 with a number of capably handled thrillers and action movies such as Murphy's War, The Hot Rock, and The Friends of Eddie Coyle.
Yellowfin Close	Kanimbla	Named after a reef fish theme, Yellowfin tuna is an ocean fish of the scientific name <i>Thunnus albacares</i> .
Yongala Street	Manoora	Named after the ship SS Yongala (launched in Southampton, England in 1903). From 1907 to early 1911, the Yongala serviced the east coast run from Melbourne to Cairns. On 23 March 1911, it steamed into a cyclone and sank without a trace south of Townsville. All 122 passengers perished including Mrs Mary Annie Woodward, the Grandmother of Jack Woodward who subdivided this area. The Yongala wreck was discovered 40 years after it sank and is now a popular dive site.

York Street	Whitfield	This street was surveyed on the 16th February 1972 and was registered with the Cairns City Council on the 15th May 1972.
Yorkeys Knob Road	Yorkeys Knob	Named for its access to the Yorkeys Knob beach. The suburb was named after George Lawson who had a beche-de-mer fishing station on Green Island in the 19th century and used to collect wood where Yorkeys Knob is. His nickname was Yorkey because he was born in Yorkshire. The road was gazetted in 1938 as a tourist road.
Young Street	Earlville	The name was approved in 1988, and was named after T.H Young, a customs officer in the late 1870s and prior to that, a Police Magistrate at Cardwell.
Yule Avenue	Clifton Beach	Named after Yule Reef, a coastal fringing reef located south east of Port Douglas. It was named after Lieutenant Charles B. Yule an early surveyor of the Queensland coastline who commandeered the ship Bramble in 1848.
Yurongi Street	Caravonica	This street was named after an Aboriginal word theme. The plans for this street were approved by the Mulgrave Shire Council in July 1973.
Yvette Court	Brinsmead	Named after an early settler in the district. The Cairns City Council approved the plans for the lots of the street in May 1999.
