




Tough times Cairns 2009/2010 and currently

What are the awards?

- A collaborative innovation program to identify businesses and individuals developing new and innovative products and processes in the Tropical North Queensland region
- Key elements:
 - Twelve steering group members;
 - Private/Public partnership (\$120, 000, \$50,000 in kind);
 - Originally four local government areas;
 - Five award categories;
 - Five judges; and
 - Gala presentation evening 30 November 2012
- Idea was first developed in July 2010 between Cairns Regional Council and AusIndustry

Tropical Innovation Awards – Aims

- To recognise, reward and support innovation, invention and commercialisation across North Queensland;
- To build economic diversification, sustainability and resilience into our economies through the creation of an outward looking business culture built upon opportunities unique to the Australian Tropics;
- To showcase and brand North Queensland as the centre of tropical expertise and knowledge for the tropical world;
- The Tropical Innovation Awards provide an opportunity for inventors, innovators and businesses to showcase their inventive and innovative ideas, projects and processes to potential investors, mentors, government officials and the public; and
- It is an opportunity for applicants to realise the potential commercial value of their invention or innovation and contribute to the export and employment potential of the region.
- To focus on the importance of innovation in driving key economic benefits for the region including:
 - Better, more competitive business practices
 - Developing and driving 'locally-grown' export opportunities
 - Stimulating employment generating activity

- \$50 entry fee (includes evening event)
- Innovators with a desire to increase their market potential, meet likeminded individuals and network with other innovators, government officials, innovation experts and investors

Assessment Criteria

- Originality, Creativity and Level of Innovation
- Competitive Advantage & Commercial Potential
- Practicality/Usability
- Social, Economic and Sustainable Design
- Efficiency, Replication/Spill-over, Timeliness, Collaboration

Eco Splash System, by Placid Pools Innovation of the Year 2010

- Proud local business
- Continuing their research into environmentally-based pool filtration techniques
- Relationship building and export development in Europe and now South Africa
- Winner of QLD Government's Big Ideas competition









Some winning examples

Pole Power, by Evolve Energy Eco Innovation Award

- Ergon Energy now supporting a 12 month trial of PolePower on Magnetic Island
- The team have also developed a roof mount version, SmartSolarTM, using smart solar technology
- 20 systems were installed on Magnetic island in 2011. The trial was successful and the team is awaiting ongoing commitment from Ergon Energy.

Transportable Aquapax, by Waterfarms Australia People's Choice Award

- World's first spring water transportation system
- The Aquapax Rehydration System is now being sold to Rio Tinto
- Opportunities for Aquapax to be utilised by AusAid, mining communities, developing countries, rural areas
- Working with local dairy industry to explore long life milk capabilities
- Inventor Martin Anton says "my ambition is to employ a lot more people and to be a growing business in this community"
