Works, Services & Activities started or completed in the last quarter

- Continued construction of the Northern Beaches Leisure Trail, Clifton Beach north section (pictured right)
- Shoulder seal, SEP works completed on the southern side of Endeavour Road, Clifton Beach
- Roundabout safety improvements, asphalt overlay of Paradise Palms Drive / Reef Drive / and Boulevard North, Kewarra Beach
- Kerb and channel renewal and pavement rehabilitation on Madang Street, Trinity Beach
- Water main replacement completed on Trinity Beach Road, (Rabaul Street to north of the Bluewater development)
- Drainage works completed on Silver Crescent, Palm Cove
- Public Toilet renewal underway at Clifton Beach
- Upgrade underway of Sewage Pump Station KB1, off Gannet St, Kewarra Beach
- Water presentation given to 15 Year 2 students from TAS Kewarra
- Foreshore pathway upgrade completed at Trinity Beach (below)



- Commenced design and construction of odour control system, sewage pump station TB1, Coastwatchers Park, Trinity Beach
- Smart Water Meter pilot program underway at Palm Cove
- Completed patches and relining of sewer main at Clifton Beach



COMING UP.....

- New car park lighting to be installed at the Bluewater Boat Ramp Carpark (off Reed Road)
- Lighting upgrade for Williams Esplanade, Palm Cove, including fairy lights/up-lighting near Sarayi and Melaleuca Resort
- Road pavement rehabilitation undertaken from No 109 Trinity Beach Road to Madang Street

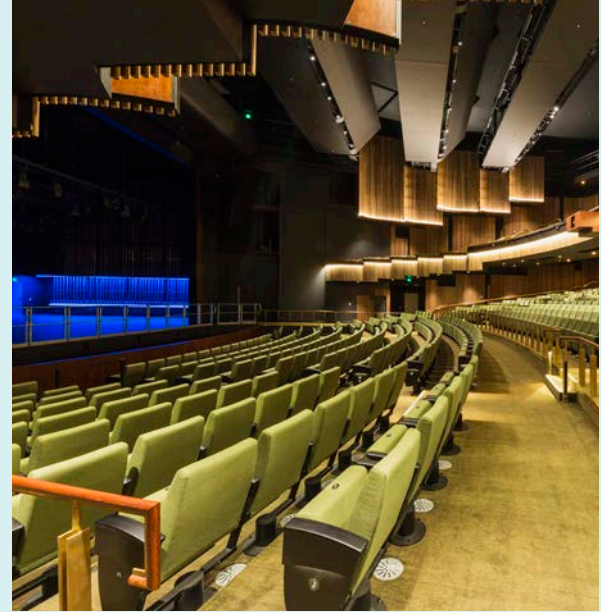
