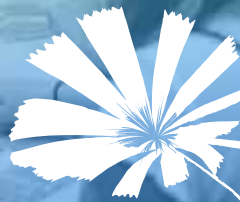

In late 2019, Cairns Regional Council facilitated a Youth Climate Summit for Student Delegates nominated by local high schools. The aim was to:

- SEEK** input from future leaders to help guide climate action from 2020-2030, including the development of a collective Youth Climate Statement
- CREATE** a space for students to express their concerns and ideas, heard by other youth, experts, Council and industry leaders
- PROVIDE** education, hope and a platform for contributing to positive action.
