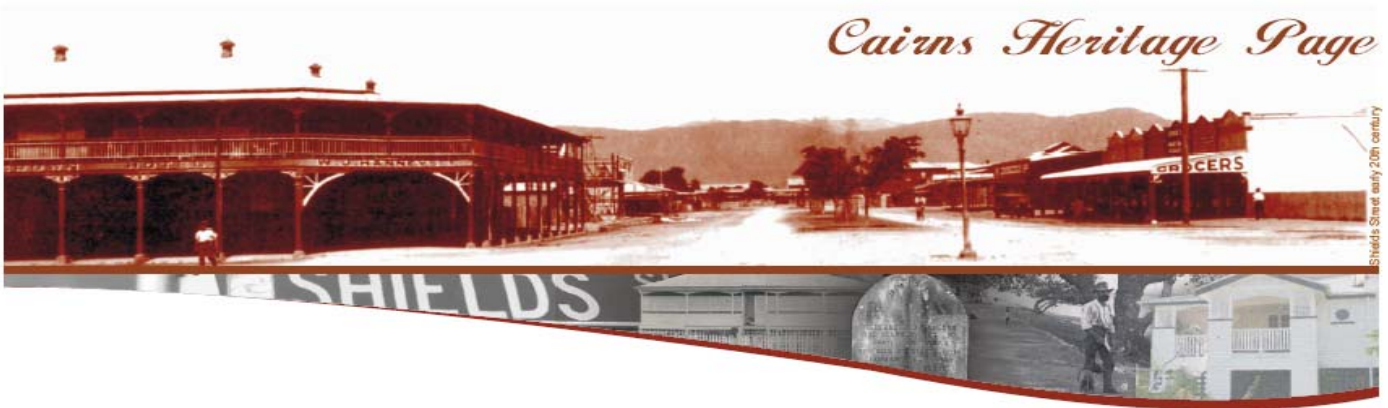


**'H' Street Names**

<b>Street Name</b>	<b>Suburb</b>	<b>Street Name Origin</b>
Hadrian Avenue	Mooroobool	All streets in Forum estate are based on a Roman theme; Hadrian was a Roman Emperor who in 122AD ordered the construction of a 'wall to separate the Romans from the Barbarians' that was built across northern Britain at its narrowest point between the Solway Firth and the north sea.
Hagen Close	Trinity Beach	Named for a Papua New Guinea theme as suggested by a resident who had served as a coast watcher there in World War II.
Haines Street	Gordonvale	No information found.
Hall Road	Gordonvale	No information found.
Hall Street	Edge Hill	Mr T.R. Hall who was once secretary of the Cairns Harbour Board.
Halligan Street	Manoora	No information found.
Halloran Close	Gordonvale	First Sergeant in charge of the Police Station in 1885.
Hambledon Drive	Edmonton	Named after the Hambledon sugar mill, which was named after the village of Hambledon in England. This was the birthplace of Thomas Swallow who established the Hambledon Plantation and Hambledon Mill.
Hamilton Road	Glen Boughton	This road was named after early pioneers of the district Alan and Phyllis Hamilton, who were farmers in the area from the 1950s. Originally growing fruit trees and pineapples for the Cairns Golden Circle factory, they switched to sugar cane production in the 1960s before selling their property in the 1970s. The survey plan for the road was registered with the former Mulgrave Shire on 1/8/1974.
Hamilton Street	Aeroglen	This street was named after the late John and Mary Jean (known as Jean) Hamilton who owned an 8 hectare property at the end of Hamilton St from the 1930's. They had a Queenslander style house and landscaped gardens on the property but had to relocate around 1941. The American Military used the property as a radar station in



WW2.

Hamlet Street	Brinsmead	No information found.
Hammond Court	Mooroobool	Early Educationalists and Medical Personnel - 1885.
Hanah Close	Mount Sheridan	No information found.
Hancock Street	Edmonton	Ursula Hancock was a pupil and teacher at the primary school, which was originally known as Blackfellows Creek School in 1887. She came from Irvinebank with her parents in 1923 and began teaching there in 1941. She was also a sole teacher at the Little Mulgrave School, riding her pushbike along the gravel road between Edmonton and Little Mulgrave each Monday and Friday.
Hanley Road	Miriwinni	No information found.
Hannam Street	Bungalow, Westcourt	Named after Willoughby Hannam, a railway engineer associated with the building of the Cairns railway that passed through the gap he discovered. He was a prominent early Freemason and the master of the first Masonic Lodge formed in Cairns on 19 <sup>th</sup> April 1886. He died on 4 March 1893, aged 55.
Harbour Drive	Trinity Park	Named after an ocean going maxi yacht theme.
Hardwick Access	Gordonvale	No information found.
Hardwick Street	Stratford	Originally known as Lily Street in the 1927 subdivision, the street was renamed after a farmer on the Kamerunga Road.
Hardy Road	Mount Sheridan	No information found.
Haren Road	Bellenden Ker	No information found.



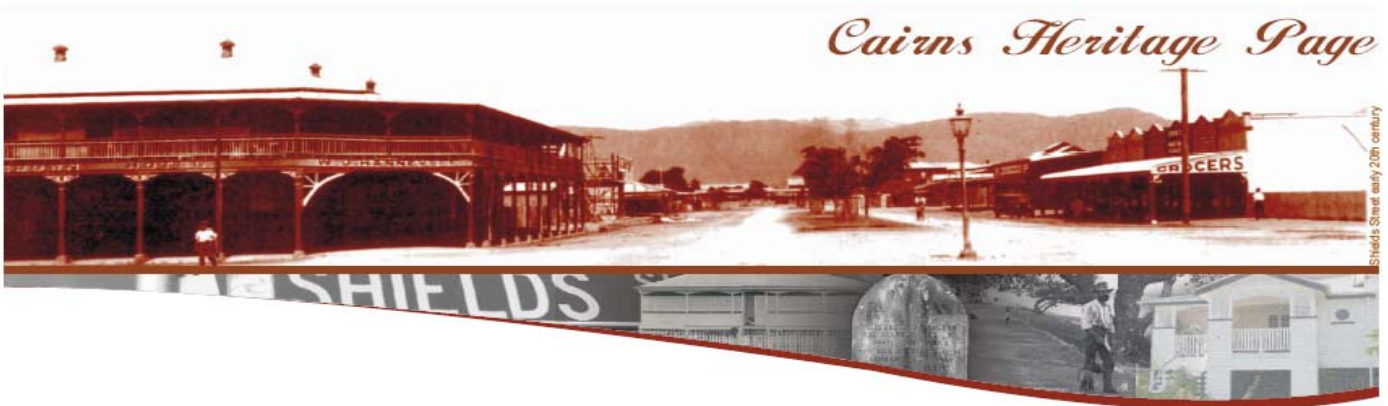
Hargreaves Street	Edmonton	No information found.
Harlequin Street	White Rock	No information found.
Harley Street	Freshwater, Kamerunga	No information found.
Harold Road	Mount Peter	Named after Mr Harold Carne, the name was approved by the Cairns City Council on 11 July 1994.
Harpa Street	Palm Cove	This street was named for a shell theme after the Harpa genus of shells.
Harper Close	Manunda	Harper is the married name of the daughter of the developer W. Murray.
Harris Road	Wrights Creek	Named after William Harris who came to the area in 1898 for the construction of the Mulgrave Mill, and later established a blacksmith shop. His second son Charles A.R. Harris was a Councillor in the Mulgrave Shire Council 1949–54 and 1967–68.
Harris Street	Parramatta Park	Named after Mrs G.I. Harris she owned the land.
Harrison Close	Kanimbla	Named after the first schoolteacher in Cairns, Hugh Harrison, who set up a private school in 1880 in Abbott Street.
Hartill Street	Edmonton	Named after Isaac Abraham Hartill, an early pioneering family in the district. He took up land in the Hambledon area in the later part of the 1880s and named the property 'Bentley Park' after his family's property 'Bentley Hall' in England. Isaac was a Butcher, Dairyman and Grocer. The survey plan was registered with the Mulgrave Shire on 8/9/1922.
Hartley Street	Bungalow, Cairns City, Portsmith	Named after Robert Taylor Hartley, one of the Customs Officers in David Spence's official landing party of 1876. He became Sub-collector of Customs at Cairns in 1882 and also led the Church of England service when the clergyman from Port Douglas was absent. He was a member of the first Health Board of Cairns, appointed on 9 July 1881, as well as being the Police Magistrate. The street used to lead to Malay Town that was situated among the mangroves in the big bend of Alligator Creek. The area has since been cleared and



reclaimed and is now occupied by oil tanks.

Harvey Creek Road	Bellenden Ker	Named because of its proximity to Harvey Creek that was named after an early pioneer who arrived in Cairns in 1877.
Harvey Road	Redlynch	Named after a Cairns settler who was among the early pioneers arriving in 1877.
Harwood Close	Brinsmead	Named after Mrs Shirley Harwood who was the first woman elected to the Mulgrave Shire Council serving for 12 years and has been recognised for her community service in the district. Married to sugar cane farmer Tom, she was born in Brisbane, the daughter of ALP Member for Brisbane and one-time Speaker of the House, John Henry Mann.
Harwood Drive	Babinda	Named after Mrs Shirley Harwood who was the first woman elected to the Mulgrave Shire Council serving for 12 years and has been recognised for her community service in the district. Married to sugar cane farmer Tom, she was born in Brisbane, the daughter of ALP Member for Brisbane and one-time Speaker of the House, John Henry Mann.
Hasell Street	Portsmith	Named after an early architect.
Hastings Street	Kamerunga	No information found.
Hatfield Close	Gordonvale	No information found.
Hawkins Street	Gordonvale	Named after George B. Hawkins, a blacksmith and early farmer who was a Cairns Divisional Board Councillor from 1903–08.
Hay Street	Mount Sheridan	Named after an island off the North Queensland coast.
Haycock Street	Clifton Beach	Named after reefs off the Queensland coast, these reefs are at the base of Haycock Island that is colloquially known as 'Scout Hat Island' after its appearance which resembles a scout's hat. The island's official title was made by Captain Owen Stanley who was sailing in the Inner Passage in the ship Rattlesnake in 1848, when he saw the island that he thought looked like a 'hay cock'.

Hayles Close	Kanimbla	Named for the Hayles family, who have been involved in the tourism and transport industries in Cairns since 1922. Robert Hayles set up a branch of the business in Cairns in 1922, with services to Green Island commencing in 1928.
Hayley Close	Woree	This close was named for a female Christian name theme.
Hayward Street	Mooroobool	Named after Miss Hayward who owned the land before it was subdivided.
Hazelwood Close	Mount Sheridan	Named for a tree theme after the Hazelwood, which is a reddish brown wood and lumber from the heartwood of the sweet gum tree and is used to make furniture. It is also known as satin walnut or red gum.
Headland Close	Edmonton	This site was the original Swallow family Hambleton Plantation, and took its name from the 'headland of cane' on the Estate. The streets survey plan was registered with the Mulgrave Shire on 1/9/1978.
Headrick Street	Manunda	Named after David Headrick, President of the Cairns Chamber of Commerce in 1942. He was president of the Cairns Show Association for many years and was an agriculture and farm produce merchant. He died in 1975 at the age of 94.
Healy Road	Miriwinni	Named after James and son Francis Healy who arrived in the Cairns area in 1876 and became involved in a variety of pioneering ventures. Constable James Healy was a member of the Native Police and died shortly after arriving in the district.
Healy Street	Gordonvale	Named after James and son Francis Healy who arrived in the Cairns area in 1876 and became involved in a variety of pioneering ventures. Constable James Healy was a member of the Native Police and died shortly after arriving in the district. His widow married James Hill of Wright's Creek.
Hearl Close	Brinsmead	Named after Mulgrave Shire Councillor Wendel Hearl.
Heather Street	Smithfield	Named after a female Christian name theme.
Heavey Crescent	Whitfield	Named by the owner of the property after Bishop Heavey who was a



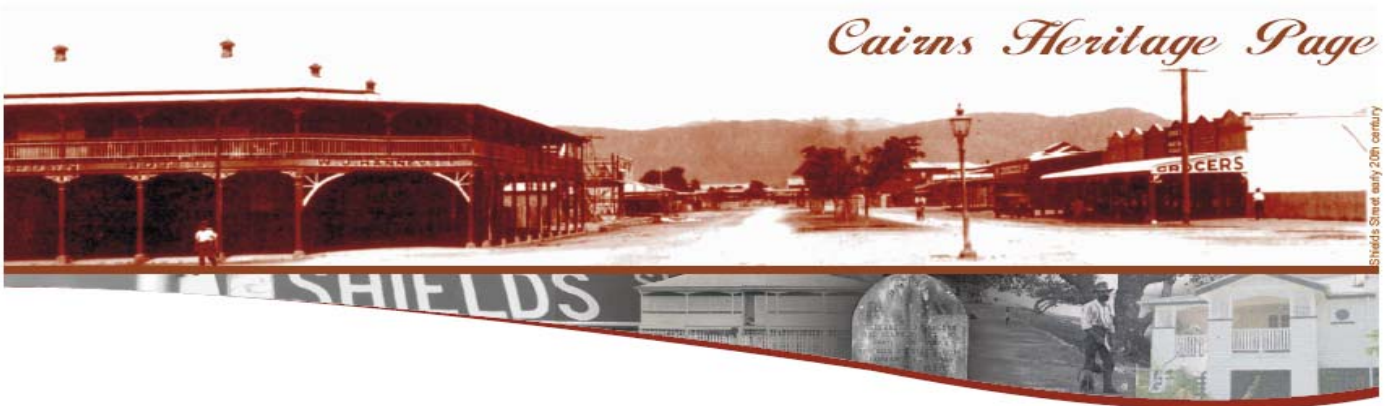
Bishop of Cairns and formerly the 3<sup>rd</sup> Vicar Apostolic of Cooktown.

Hector Close	Westcourt	Named after Mr Vivian Hector Veivers the Chief Draftsman of Cairns Council from 1936-1975.
Hedley Close	Redlynch	Named after the developer of the subdivision.
Helen Close	Smithfield	Named after a female Christian name theme.
Helix Close	Clifton Beach	No information found.
Hellmuth Street	Whitfield	This street is named after the Hellmuth family, who were very early settlers in Cairns. The original Mrs Gertrude Hellmuth (nee Thompson) was born in Wales on 7 <sup>th</sup> May 1878 and with her parents travelled by the sailing ship 'Scottish Knight' to arrive in Townsville on 15 <sup>th</sup> June 1881. Gertrude married Edward Jackson Hellmuth and together they had 12 children. Edward who was managing a cane farm for Mr G.R. Mayers at Nelson (Gordonvale) died when the youngest child was only a few months old, and the family had to work hard to survive without any outside financial assistance. Mrs Gertrude Hellmuth passed away on 9 November 1955, aged 77.
Helsdon Close	Clifton Beach	Named after a reef off the Queensland coast.
Henderson Close	Kanimbla	Named after an engineer in the area in 1910.
Henley Street	Earlville	Named after Henley Hill, which was named after Bill Henley, the owner of the property and who had a piggery there. Originally called Gavioli's Hill, it was donated to the Council by Bill Henley on the proviso that the name be changed to Henley's Hill.
Hepburn Street	White Rock	Named for a motion picture theme after Katharine Hepburn who was a legendary actress and starred in numerous films between 1948 and 1989. She also holds the most 'Best Actress' Oscar Awards.
Herald Street	Bentley Park	Named after a ship carrying immigrants to Australia.
Heritage South Street	Redlynch	Named for a historical and cane theme.

Hermes Close	Mooroobool	All streets in this estate are based on a Roman theme, Hermes is the Greek name (Mercury is the Roman name) of the fleet footed messenger of the gods.
Heron Close	Kewarra Beach	Named after an Australian beaches theme, Heron Beach is located on Heron Island off the North Queensland coast.
Herries Street	Earlville	Named after Matron Herries, who delivered many Cairns babies in her private hospital in McLeod Street.
Hesp Road	Aloomba	Named after G. Hesp, a Cairns Shire Councillor from 1921–23.
Hesp Street	Yorkeys Knob	Named after well-known local James Hesp who purchased here and held the lease for the caravan park in the 1960s.
Hessels Close	Brinsmead	Named after Fred W. Hessel, a Mulgrave Shire Councillor from 1973–1975. He was a resident of Holloways Beach and a park in Jacaranda was named in his honour. Originally named Lucey Close, on the survey plan, this name was not ever used in the subdivision. The Mulgrave Shire approved the subdivision. The survey plan was registered with the Register of Titles in June 1985.
Hester Street	Edmonton	Barnie Hester was a Hambledon Mill worker.
Hetherton Street	Smithfield	No information found.
Hibiscus Lane	Holloways Beach	Originally known as the Laneway it was renamed to accommodate the floral theme of the suburb. The Hibiscus or rosemallow is a flowering plant known for its showy flowers and many are used as landscape shrubs. There about 200–220 species in the genus.
Hickey Close	Gordonvale	Named after Michael Hickey, originally a packer on the Cairns to Herberton route, and then who owned a pub and a store at Harvey's Creek in the late 1880s.



Hickling Access	Gordonvale	Named after an early farming family, and the streets survey plan was registered with the former Mulgrave Shire on 17/11/1995.
Hickory Street	Holloways Beach	Many street names in this suburb were named for a floral theme at the suggestion of resident Anne Edwards. The hickory tree belongs to the genus of <i>Carya</i> and the wood is extremely tough yet flexible and valued for use as tool handles. Hickory wood is the preferred type for smoking curing meats because of the flavour it imparts to the meat.
Hicks Close	Kewarra Beach	Named after Zachary Hicks, a senior lieutenant aboard Captain Cook's ship the Endeavour.
Hideaway Close	Palm Cove	Streets in this subdivision are named after a tranquillity theme.
Highleigh Road	Gordonvale	Highleigh was the name of Henry Simmonds home and settlement situated between Packer's Camp and the Mulgrave River.
Hill Road	Wrights Creek	Named after the owners of the land through which the street passes who were very early settlers of the area. James ran a hotel called the Musgrave on Wright Creek, but worked as a carpenter at Hambleton Mill and he drowned in flooded McKinnon Creek in 1887. He was married to the widow of Constable James Healy, one of the early police officers in Cairns.
Hill Street	Manunda	Mr W.R.O. Hill was one of the first Police Magistrates in Cairns.
Hillcrest Street	Bayview Heights	Named for its position on the crest of the Hill.
Hillman Place	Bentley Park	No information found.
Hilltop Close	Bayview Heights	Named for its position on the top of the Hill.
Hillview Crescent	Whitfield	Named for its scenic views.
Himalaya Close	Mount Sheridan	Named for a ship theme after the steamship Himalaya which had three masts with full rigging





Hispidia Court	Mount Sheridan	This is named after <i>Acalypha hispida</i> commonly known as the chenille plant because of the showy cattail pendent clusters, which resemble the chenille fabric.
Hives Street	Gordonvale	Named after early pioneering family and Cairns Divisional Councillor F. Hives 1901–14.
Hoad Street	Earlville	Named after W. Hoad, a property developer and dairyman.
Hoare Lane	Gordonvale	Named after J. G. Hoare a city councillor and Mayor of the City of Cairns in 1911 and 1920-23.
Hoare Road	Gordonvale	Named after J.G. Hoare a city councillor and Mayor of the City of Cairns in 1911 and 1920-23.
Hoare Street	Manoora, Manunda	Named after J.G. Hoare a city councillor and Mayor of the City of Cairns in 1911 and 1920-23.
Hobbler Street	Bungalow	Named after G.A. Hobbler, Assistant District Mining Engineer for the Cairns to Herberton Railway in the 1880s and 1890s.
Hobson Drive	Brinsmead	Named after Mulgrave Shire Councillor – Alderman William Doyle Hobson who was present at the first meeting of the Municipal Council held in July 1885. He was a prominent cane farmer and businessman.  The street was subdivided in 5 stages between 1985 and 1988.
Hockey Avenue	Smithfield	Named after Paul Hockey, a local one-armed man, who made history when he became the first disabled person to reach the summit of Everest from the north side in 2005.
Hodel Street	Whitfield	Named after Mr F.C. Hodel, once a member of Cairns Harbour Board and who was once a member of the Cairns Harbour Board as well as being appointed to the Barron Falls Hydro-electric Board in 1930.
Hodkinson Street	Redlynch	Named by James Venture Mulligan in 1874 after his friend, William Oswald Hodgkinson (1835 –1900), Mining Warden (1878 – 1883) on the Etheridge & Palmer Goldfields) and Member of the Legislative Assembly for Burke (1873-75 & 1888-93).



Hoffman Close	White Rock	Named for a motion picture theme after Dustin Hoffman, a prolific actor who won two 'Best Actor' Oscar Awards for 'Kramer v Kramer' and 'Rain Man'.
Hogan Court	White Rock	This street was named after motion picture them for the enormously popular Australian TV presenter and actor, Paul Hogan (The Paul Hogan Show, Crocodile Dundee – 1986). Mulgrave Shire approved the subdivision. The survey plan was registered with the Register of titles on 28 November 1994.
Hogan Street	Westcourt	Named after Michael (Mike) Hogan, who was the first Superintendent of Ambulance Brigade that began in Cairns in 1904. He was also an Alderman from 1921-1927.
Holden Close	Manoora	Named after Alan Stuart Holden who was born in 1917. Alan worked for Cairns City Council 1935-1965 and was Town Supervisor in Weipa 1966-1979. He was co-founder of the Edge Hill Memorial Bowls Club (built on land originally held by the RSL Branch) which opened in January 1955. He became President of the Club in 1952, a position he held for many years. Alan Holden was also actively involved in the RSL, Freemasons, various school committees and the building of the Edge Hill tennis courts. Hollett Close	Manunda	Named after early settler.
Hollingsworth Street	Portsmith	Named after D.C. Hollingsworth (1892-1976), an authorised surveyor who worked around Cairns between 1937 and the early 1970's.
Holloways Beach Access Road	Holloways Beach	Providing admittance to Holloways Beach that was originally known as San Remo Beach.
Holly Street	Mooroobool	The estate in which this street exists is based on a floral theme. Holly is a genus of about 400 species of flowering plants with a small berry usually red when mature. The spiky leaves provide protections for sheltering birds. In the western cultures the Holly is traditionally used as a Christmas decoration.
Hollywood Boulevard	White Rock	Named after motion picture theme, Hollywood was the location where movies were produced and was nicknamed 'Tinsel Town'.



Holman Street	Edmonton	Name of a Hambledon Mill Employee that served for 10 years or more.
Holmes Street	Stratford	No information found.
Holroyd Court	Mount Sheridan	No information found.
Homestead Close	Edmonton	The location of the original Swallow's Hambledon Sugar Plantation home. The street's survey plan was lodged with the former Mulgrave Shire on 1/5/1978.
Honeysuckle Street	Bayview Heights	Named after honeysuckles which are arching shrubs or twining vines in the family of Caprifoliaceae. Another name for this plant is woodbine or eglantine a term used in Milton's verse L'Allegro.
Hood Street	Trinity Park	Streets in this subdivision were named after ships. HMS Hood was a British Battle Cruiser that was sunk by the German Battleship the Bismarck in 1941.
Hook Close	Brinsmead	Named after T.R.S Hook, the first of the businessmen attracted to Cairns by the sugar boom in the district. An auctioneer, he was appointed as clerk to the Cairns Divisional Board on the 6 <sup>th</sup> August 1880, a position he held until his resignation on the 8 <sup>th</sup> February 1881. He drowned in March 1887 whilst trying to cross McKinnon's Creek after returning home from a race meeting at Granite Gorge.
Hooper Close	Gordonvale	Named after Mr W.A. Hooper who was superintendent of Railways in Cairns.
Hop Wah Close	Brinsmead	Named after the Hop Wah estate where the first sugar mill in the district was located and was established by Andrew Leon in the early 1880s. As well as sugar, many other crops were grown here including rice, cotton and tropical fruits. The site was on Clarkes Creek near where the Stockland Shopping Centre is now.
Hope Street	Clifton Beach	Named after a reef off the Queensland coast.
Hopkins Street	White Rock	No information found.



Horton Lane	Gordonvale	Named after a local family.
Hoskin Road	Miriwinni, Bartle Frere	No information found.
Hospital Street	Babinda	Named after the location of the Babinda Hospital.
Houston Street	Clifton Beach	No information found.
Howard Kennedy Drive	Babinda, Miriwinni	This drive was originally part of the Bruce Highway until the bypass was constructed and it was named after Mr Howard Kennedy (snr) who played a large part in promoting junior sport in the area. He was a cane farmer who also coached a football side. In 1987 he won the British Empire Medal for services to sport.
Howe Street	Cairns North	Named after William Francis Seymour Howe, Johnstone Shire Councillor 1917-18 and Shire Chairman in 1919. He was manager of the Mulgrave Sugar Mill, 1919- 39 when he died in a motor vehicle accident in Innisfail.
Howe Street	Gordonvale	Named after William Francis Seymour Howe, Johnstone Shire Councillor 1917-18 and Shire Chairman in 1919. He was manager of the Mulgrave Sugar Mill, 1919-39 when he died in a motor vehicle accident in Innisfail.
Howie Close	Kewarra Beach	No information found.
Hoya Court	Mount Sheridan	Hoya is a genus of tropical climbing plants with about 200-300 species. They are native to Australia, Southern Asia and Polynesia. The common names for this genus are waxplant, waxvine, waxflower or just hoyo.
Hudson Street	Whitfield	Named after the one time District Superintendent of Railways.
Hughes Close	Redlynch	Named after Thomas Hughes, a railway worker who was killed when struck by a wagon on No. 4 Tunnel of the Kuranda Railway construction on the 27 <sup>th</sup> of March 1888.
Hulbert Street	Trinity Park	No information found.



Humbolt Close	Edmonton	Named after a ship that carried immigrants to Australia, amongst the passengers were Peter and Maren Petersen from Denmark travelling to Bowen in 1872.
Hunt Street	Manunda	Named after Thomas Hunt O.S.A. a missionary priest resident in Cairns.
Huntley Crescent	Redlynch	No information found.
Huon Street	Trinity Beach	Named after a Papua New Guinea theme after suggested by a resident who had served as a coast watcher there in World War II. Huon Gulf is in the Solomon Sea off the eastern Coast of Papua New Guinea.
Hussar Close	Kanimbla	No information found.
Hussey Road	Mount Peter	Named after an early farming family in the district. The survey plan for the street was registered on 1/10/1998.
Hutchings Street	Bungalow	Named after Mr Frank Hutchings, farmer and owner of land prior to sub-division.
Hutchinson Street	Edge Hill, Whitfield	Named by the owner of the property after Bishop John Hutchinson, the first Vicar Apostolic Vicariate of Cooktown. He passed away in Cooktown and is buried there.
Hyacinth Close	Edmonton	This close was named after the common name for a species of orchid. The close was originally named Pansy Close but was changed after the developers thought the lots would not sell due to the negative connotations of the word 'pansy'. The survey plan for the close was registered with the Mulgrave Shire on 4/8/1997.
Hymes Street	Kanimbla	Named after Mr Hymes who opened the first store in Cairns.
Hythe Street	Kamerunga	No information found.
