Street Name	Suburb	Street Name Origin
Zamia Street	Holloways Beach	Many street names in this suburb were named for a floral theme at the suggestion of resident Anne Edwards. Zamia is a genus of tree with the common name cycad. Cycad. Mulgrave Shire Council approved the subdivision for Zamia Street. The survey plan was registered in August 1973.
Zammit Street	Edmonton	This street was named after a Hambledon Mill employee that served for 10 years or more. Cairns City Council approved plans for the street in January of 2006.
Zanzoo Close	Redlynch	Named after the Zanzoo Weir Crossing over the Freshwater Creek. The street was named around 1987.
Zarr Street	Edmonton	This street was named after Mrs Zaratich who was commonly known as Mrs Zarr. She was a governess of Polish descent who, along with Otto Keller was said to be a survivor from the Titanic. She had a hut on the Mt. Peter goldfields where she supplied vegetables, eggs and chickens to the miners.
Zebrina Street	Redlynch	This street is named after <i>Tradescantia zebrina</i> , common name, Wandering Jew. Zebrina is native to Mexico however it is classed as an invasive environmental weed in North Queensland. The Cairns City Council approved plans for the Street in March 1996.
Zechaen Court	Bentley Park	Named after a Dutch exploration ship that was used in Abel Tasman's fleet on his 1642 voyage during which he discovered Tasmania. The Mulgrave Shire Council approved the plans for the street in May of 1992.
Zircon Street	Bayview Heights	Streets in this subdivision are named after minerals and gemstones. Zircon is a zirconium silicate of which some translucent varieties are cut into gems. It is the oldest known mineral in the world, found in Western Australia at 4.4 billion years old.
