

Videos outline ideas to growing well

Council has released a series of eight short videos outlining the key concepts it believes need to be considered for the city's sustainable growth.

The Cairns population is predicted to reach up to 241,000 by the year 2050, an increase of almost 70,000 people.

The short videos explore the factors that determine where and how to accommodate future growth, while protecting the things the community loves about the city and region.

Council is encouraging residents to be part of shaping a whole-of-community conversation on growing well

Ask yourself these three questions

- 1 What's my risk?
- Where will I go?
- Can I survive for at least three days without power and running water?

Being ready for disasters is a shared responsibility between emergency services and communities. People who are well-prepared know what to do and can look after themselves. It's important to be ready for whatever may happen, particularly when weather conditions are becoming increasingly unpredictable. Understanding these risks is especially important for new residents to Cairns.

1 What's my risk?

Being prepared for a natural disaster is all about knowing your risk. If you live in a low-lying area prone to flooding, you could also be affected by storm surges. You can find out your hazard zone at Council's website.

Storm tide zone: Storm surge is a significant rise in the ocean level caused by a cyclone. Council has three storm tide zones according to severity – red is the most at risk (closest to sea level), followed by orange and yellow. If you're not in a storm surge area you are in a white zone.

Flood zone: There's flooding in Cairns every wet season. Thankfully, it's normally minor but wet season flash flooding can rise and become dangerous very quickly. Areas near waterways within the Barron Delta and Russell and Mulgrave River catchments, are more likely to flood. Consider the risk of flooding along your evacuation route and at your property.

Where will I go?

Having a disaster and evacuation plan means you will be prepared no matter the situation.

What's your plan?

Discuss these questions when preparing your plan.

- What risks do we face? Do we live in a low-lying area that could flood or be in a storm surge zone?
- Will we evacuate, or shelter in place?
- If we evacuate, where will we go and how will we get there?
- Have we planned a back-up evacuation route in case roads are cut, or are impassable because everyone is trying to leave at the same time?
- Where will we meet? Remember that your household members may be at work, school, studying, shopping or visiting friends.

Important information about evacuation and storm tide shelters

In a cyclone, Council advises evacuation based on storm surge, not wind. Residents in storm tide zones can evacuate to a public storm tide cyclone shelter. If you don't live in a storm tide zone, you may be refused entry.

Public storm tide cyclone shelters are a place of last resort for residents who have nowhere else to go. They are designed to save lives by housing the maximum number of people - there are no beds, you'll have a plastic chair to sit in, and there aren't any cooking facilities.

Sheltering in place

If you aren't in a storm surge area, and live in a property built after 1984*, your best, and most comfortable option is to shelter at home. Choose the strongest room in your house, normally the bathroom, and take your household emergency kit with you.

Residents concerned about sheltering at home should have a plan to stay with family or friends outside the hazard area.

*In 1984 building standards were changed to ensure homes were more cyclone resilient.



Can I survive for at least three days without power and running water?

If a natural disaster strikes, electricity and water supplies could be cut; phones and internet may not work; the airport, port, roads and bridges could be damaged; and shops and petrol stations may be closed

It may take several days for it to be safe for emergency crews to begin repair works and supply lines to reopen.

If an emergency occurs, you need to be self-sufficient for at least three days.

A household emergency kit is a must. Use any type of sturdy, easy-to-transport boxes or bags to pack your emergency kit.

A disaster can strike at any time. Pack or check your emergency kit now to avoid the last-minute rush if disaster strikes.

Check your kit regularly to ensure food is in date, batteries are okay and your cash supply is intact.

Emergency kit checklist

Each kit should have enough supplies and basic necessities for everyone in your household including:

- 10 litres of water per person
 - Non-perishable food (eg canned, dried)
- Can opener, cutlery and cooking equipment
- Small portable cooking stove
- Waterproof matches and lighters
- First aid kit and manual
- Essential medications, prescriptions and dosages
- Toilet paper and personal hygiene items
- Toiletries toothbrush, toothpaste, sanitiser, soap
- Battery/wind-up torch or lantern
- Battery powered or wind-up radio
- Mobile phone and powerbank
- Plastic garbage bags, ties
- Utility knife or multi-tool

Disaster Dashboard

The Cairns Disaster Dashboard publishes real-time information on road conditions, weather warnings, and power outages.

It includes flood and traffic cams, storm tide zones and evacuation routes.
